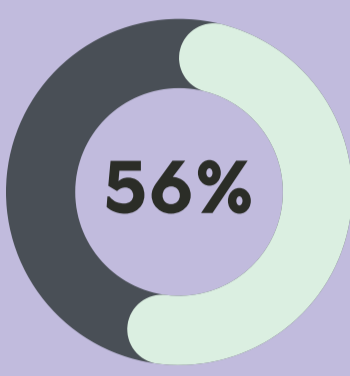
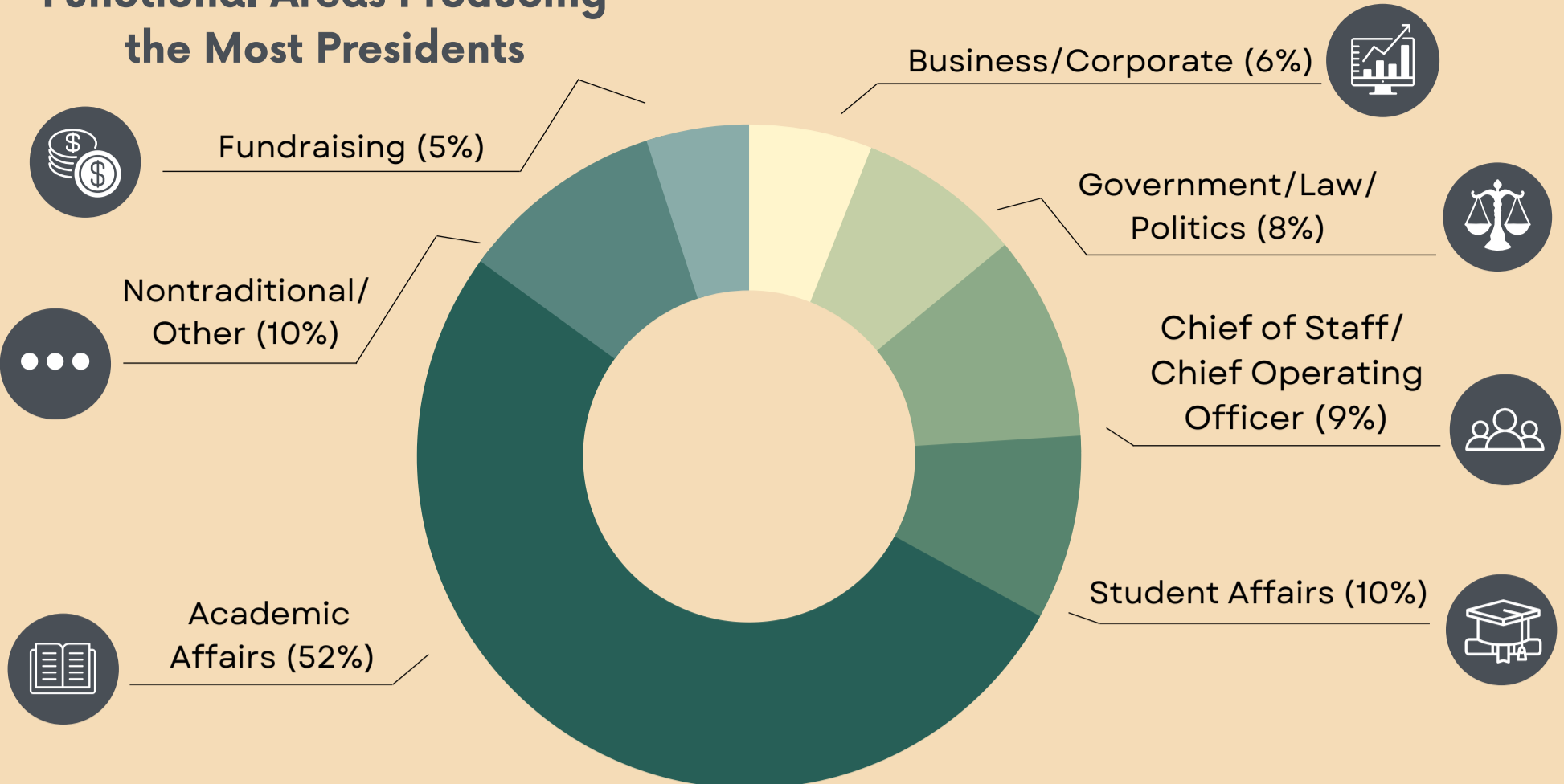

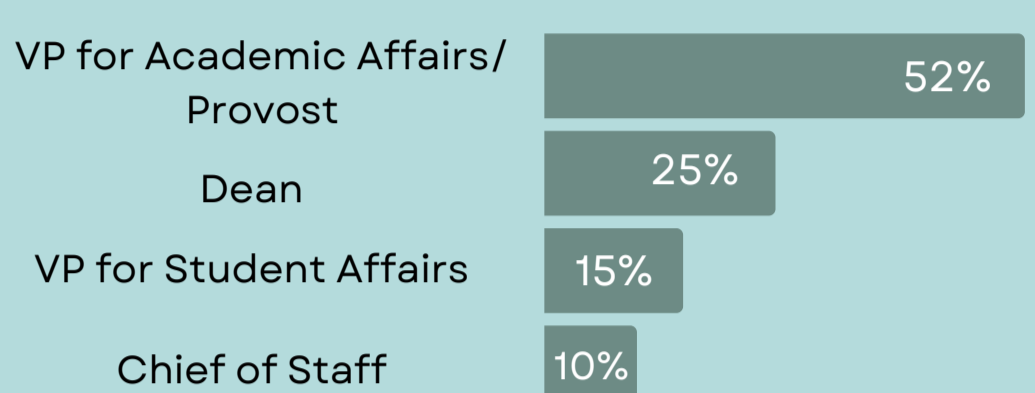

72% of HBCU presidents are in their 1st presidency



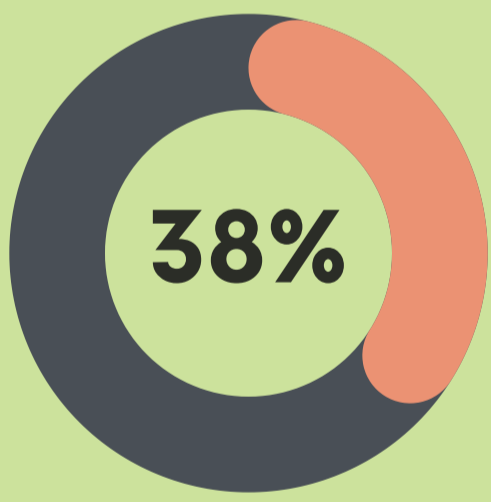
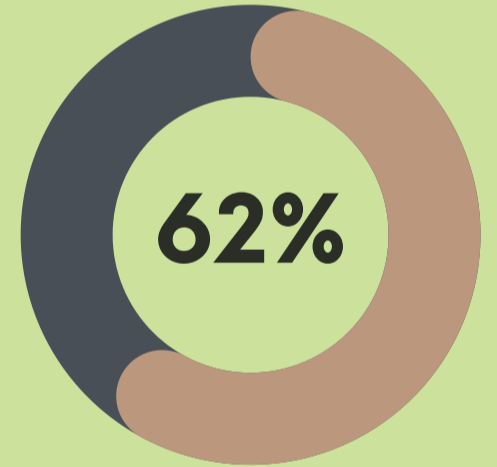

62% of HBCU Presidents earned their undergraduate degrees at an HBCU

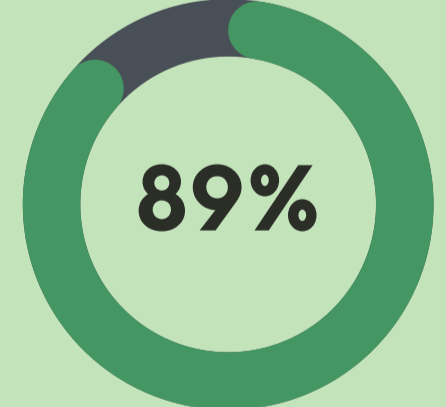


38% of HBCU Presidents earned their undergraduate degrees at a Predominantly White Institution (PWI)



Howard University has educated the most presidents at the undergraduate level

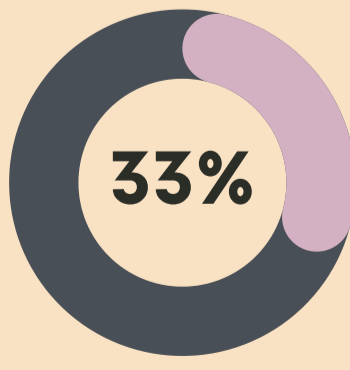
89% of HBCU Presidents earned their doctoral degrees at a PWI



Fewer than 10% HBCU Presidents earned their doctoral degrees at an HBCU

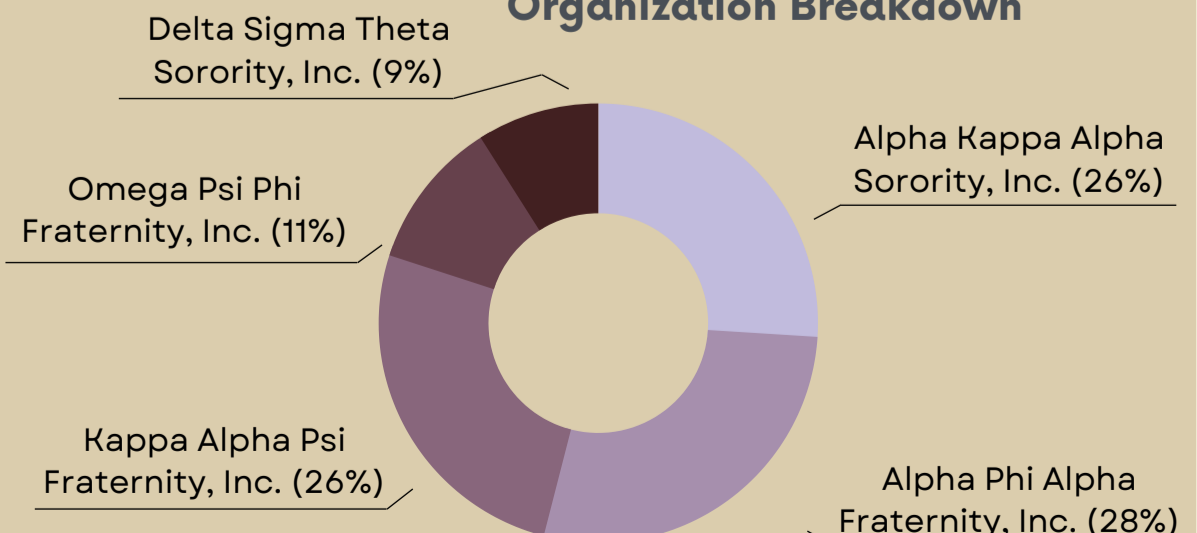


Howard University, Clark Atlanta University, and Jackson State University have educated the most HBCU Presidents at the doctoral level
